#### DIRECTOR'S **UPDATE**

Each year, on June 27, the National Association of People with AIDS (NAPWA), with support from CDC, AIDS.gov. CDC's National Prevention Information Network (CDC NPIN), and other partners, leads the commemoration of National HIV Testing Day (NHTD). This special edition of Connections is dedicated to NHTD. The theme of this annual observance is "Take the Test, Take Control," which sends a powerful message about learning one's HIV status. More than 200,000 Americans infected with HIV do not even know they are infected, maintaining the urgency to take action on the national, state, local, and individual levels. HIV is a serious, infectious, and deadly disease, and knowing one's status is a critical step to protecting one's own health and that of others.

## **Mayors Campaign Against HIV**

A key activity each year for the National Association of People with AIDS (NAPWA) is the Mayors Campaign Against HIV, in its sixth year. Approximately 200 mayors have been asked to support National HIV Testing Day (NHTD) by hosting HIV testing campaigns in their cities, conducting press conferences to discuss local HIV testing resources, or issuing proclamations in support of NHTD. NAPWA not only partners with mayors throughout the United States, but also collaborates with Congressional lawmakers. For the fourth time, NAPWA and U.S. Representative Barbara Lee (D-CA)

will host a press conference on U.S. Capitol grounds to focus attention on the HIV epidemic and the need for those at risk for HIV to get tested. Moreover, to ensure communities have

the resources to mount an effective HIV testing campaign, NAPWA makes available promotional materials to local health departments, community clinics, and other community-based organizations that participate in NHTD. NAPWA also will host a comprehensive Skills Building Institute to share successful promotional techniques for NHTD events. For more information, go to www.napwa.org.
